3) Each day, we will also learn about a new country where ELCA World Hunger works. We will learn about our neighbors in that country and some of the projects ELCA World Hunger supports to help our neighbors.



This study is free and is sent to your email each week. Each email contains:

- A BibleProject video
- A short audio message
- 2-3 Scripture readings
- 6-8 discussion questions

The BibleProject is a nonprofit animation studio that produces short-form, fully animated Bible videos and other Bible resources to make the biblical story accessible to everyone, everywhere. In addition to this weekly Bible study they have created many other Bible videos, podcasts, and Bible resources to help people experience the story of the Bible. All are 100% free.

The writers for the BibleProject believe the Bible is a unified story that leads to Jesus. This diverse collection of ancient books overflows with wisdom for our modern world. As they let the biblical story speak for itself, they believe the message of Jesus will transform individuals and entire communities. Their Bible resources help people experience the Bible in a way that is approachable, engaging, and transformative. They do this by showcasing the literary art of the Scriptures and tracing the themes found in them from beginning to end. Rather than taking the stance of a specific tradition or denomination, they create materials to elevate the Bible for all people and draw our eyes to its unified message.

If you are looking for a new resource to add to your spiritual practices, the BibleProject may offer just what you are searching for.
