

If we have violated another's conscience, if we have caused someone to fall, we are deeply sorry. For failing to do all Christ expects of the church, we repent and seek your forgiveness. Amen.
- P: All who love God are known by God, whose intention is that we live by eternal values, in loving relationships with one another. God applauds our

efforts to rid our lives of false gods we create, habits that destroy, and prejudices that divide. We count on God to understand us, to free us from our bondage to sin, and to dwell among us, transforming our lives. Let us praise God forever and ever!


