### PD Ann's Corner Meet Me at the Well

"Issac planted crops in the land and the same year reaped a hundredfold because the Lord blessed him. The man became rich and his wealth continued to grow herds and servants that the Philistines envied him. So, all the wells that his father's servants had dug in the time of his father Abram, the Philistines stopped up, filling them with earth."

### Genesis 26:12-15

All of you have had to deal with plumbing problems in your house at some time. Something happened to pipes bringing water into the house or pipes taking waste away. We have even had to deal with plumbing problems with our pipes in the church kitchen requiring major work to correct the problem. There can be problems with pipes rusting, pipes breaking or pipes being clogged and unable to deliver fresh water. Sometimes pipes can be contaminated with something that can cause illness. In today's Bible story, the Philistines deliberately filled Issac's wells with dirt because they were jealous of the blessings Issac was receiving.

This is an analogy for our relationship with God. God offered us grace which opened up the lines of communication between God and us. He wants to forgive us, talk with us, listen to us, heal us, and love us. He sent Jesus to show us how to relate to him. Jesus is the key to being able to go directly to God. Jesus promised the Holy Spirit would be available to help us talk to God when we do not know what to say. What are some of the things that interrupt the flow of living water that comes from Jesus and the Holy Spirit? Sometimes we break the lines of communication by not being open to talking to and listening to God. Sometimes the world interferes and blocks our relationship. Here are some things that block the line: unhealthy attitudes like envy, bitterness, rage, anger, and malice; we make wrong decisions by choosing the wrong friends to associate with or listening to people who do not follow God's ways; We choose the wrong actions like brawling, drunkenness and following the ways of the world; We let doubts, greed, or fear take over. (See Ephesians 4:29-31 and Colossians 3:5-10)

Whenever the plumbing is broken in your house you have to call someone who specializes in repairing and cleaning up the mess. The same is true with our spiritual life. Jesus wants us to ask the Holy Spirit to help us unclog the lines of communication. Jesus said "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." John 1:9. "Come now let us settle the matter, says the Lord, though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red as crimson, they shall be like wool." Isaiah 1:8. Once you know the area you need to work on then ask for forgiveness. Spend time reading scripture and in prayer. Listen so that you are open to hearing what God wants for you. Spend time in worship and with other Christians so that when trouble comes you have the support you need to keep the communication lines open. What area do you need to work on? Where is the problem? God is faithful and will not only open the lines of communication, but will provide you with an abundance of blessings. He will give you life.

### Looking Back with Alicia Mayes

In the June Newsletter I told about going through the kitchen cupboards in the church office and some of the things I found. I also found 6 Guest Registries from over the years. We used to have a stand in the Narthex at the front door going into the sanctuary where visitors could sign to let us know when they were at the church and where they were from. The books ranged in dates from November of 1948 through the end of 2003. I thought it would be interesting to let you know where some of these visitors were from. We had several visitors over the years from California. Some other states out west were Washington, Oregon, New Mexico, Arizona, and Texas. Florida and the New England states were the farthest away in the eastern United States.

Out of the country we had visitors from Inga in Finland, Dodoma in Tanzania, Latvia in Northern Europe, Harenberg and Langgons in Germany, Kondra in India, Kilmarnock in Scotland, Japan, a missionary from South America and from Canada, Vanderhoof and Vancouver in British Columbia, Quebec and Ontario.

We also had a few unusual visitors over the years. In 1979 John Doe, Saint Peter from Vatican City and Sherlock Holmes and Dr. Watson from London, England were here. In 1983 Santa Claus, Superman, Snoopy (was here twice), and Mickey Mouse from Disney World were here. We also had Peanut here in 1984. The Easter Bunny was here in 1985. In 1987, The Monkees, the singing group from Los Angeles, with all their names, Peter Tork, Micky Dolenz, Davy Jones, and Michael Nesmith. As you can see we have had a wide range of visitors over the years.

I also ran across a package of postcards that were made around 1953 when the Educational Building was completed. It says on the postcard that the church was built in 1918 at a cost of \$75,000. It also states that the Educational Building was completed in 1953 at a cost of \$225,000. There is a picture of the church with the educational building without the house. It states on the front of the card under the picture that, the Parsonage in front of the wing at the left is not shown. It says you should place on the card a 2 cent stamp. That really dates the card. Postage for a postcard today is 56 cents. As I was looking through old binders I ran across a flyer advertising our first Thanks and Giving Dinner. It was November 26, 1998.

In the June Newsletter I told about Emanuel giving \$25,000 to a Mission Church, New Creation Lutheran Church, in Ottawa, Ohio. In the minutes of Parish Planning Council for May of 2000 it stated that Emanuel received a Westminster Chime Clock from New Creation an appreciation gift for our donation.

I remembered seeing a clock in the library. I went in to take a look and it is the Westminster Chime Clock. It has to be the one that New Creation gave us as a gift. That was 25 years ago. (See photo on next page)

In 1999 there were many discussions as to Emanuel hiring a Parish Nurse and for hiring a new Visitation Pastor.

On Sunday, May 28, 2000 there was a special Parish Planning Council Meeting to discuss and vote to hire Carol Columber as Emanuel's Parish Nurse. It was decided to hire Carol and she began her duties June 5, 2000.

Another special Parish Planning Meeting was held Sunday, August 18, 2000 to discuss and vote whether to hire Pastor Jack Moore as Emanuel's next Visitation Pastor. It was decided to hire Pastor Moore.

Amy Dennis was voted as Emanuel's Director of Youth and Education at the semi -annual congregational meeting held May 6, 2001.

On July 29, 2001 Amy Dennis, Jack Moore, and Carol Columber were installed by Assistant to the Bishop, Kathy Schibler, into their positions as Director of Youth and Education, Visitation Pastor, and Parish Nurse.

A reception followed the services for the three that were installed. Many of you remember Carol Columber, Amy Dennis, and Jack Moore. In the Pastor's Report in the minutes of Parish Planning Council dated June 12, 2001 it was stated that letters had been sent to the nursing care facilities in Marion about communion being brought in for the residents that are members of Emanuel. That is the first report I have read about letters being sent to start this process.

In the same June 12 minutes the Board of Properties reported that the fans in the sanctuary were going to be replaced. They were ordered at no charge since the first ones had never worked correctly. Maybe you have never looked up and noticed that there are fans in the ceiling of the sanctuary that are on all the time.

As a side note about the fans, the Altar Guild started using oil in the Eternal Candle beside the pulpit several years ago instead of the wax candles we used before. At first in the winter the flame only lasted 4 or 5 days and in the summer it lasted a full 7 days with the oil. We tried to understand this weird problem we were having. We were filling the vessel with the same amount of oil each week and had to refill before the week was over in the winter. Then we were told that the fans in the ceiling go one direction in the winter to pull the heat down and the other direction in the summer. This change in direction was causing the candle to use more oil in the winter. Maybe some of you understand how this works. The Altar Guild only knows that we have to fill the candle more often in the winter.
